STATE OF NEW-HAMPSHIRE.

ROCKINGHAM.....SS.

ON this Eighteenth day July, 1820, personally appeared in open court at Concord, *Hall Bergen*; before *John Harvey and* Esqrs. Justices of the Court of Common Pleas for the said County of Rockingham, being a Court of Record for the said County of Rockingham, having the power of fine and imprisonment. *Lachariah Dumbly* aged *fifty one* years, resident in *Louisa*, in said county, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath declare that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows:—

He enlisted in the Company commanded by Capt James Gray in the 3^d Regiment in the New Hampshire Line Commanded by Col Alexander Scammon on the 16th day of April 1775 for the term of three years that he served the full term of his enlistment when he again enlisted in the same Company and same Regiment on the Continental establishment for during the war that he served the full term of his enlistment and was discharged at West Point. That the date of his original declaration in order to obtain a pension is the 8th day of April 1818 that he has received a pension the number of his Pension Certificate is 3382.

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the 8th day of March, 1818; and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale or in any manner, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it, as to bring myself within the provision of an Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the 18th day of March 1818; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me; nor have I any income other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed. My occupation is *that of a farmer and not of* sufficient ability to pursue it

in order to obtain the provision made by the late act
of Congress entitled an act to provide for certain persons
engaged in the land and naval service of the
United States in the revolutionary war that he the said
Lecheviah Quimby sometime in the Month of April
1777 enlisted into the aforesaid service as a private soldier
in the Town of Brentwood in said State for three
years in the company commanded by Captain James
Grey third regiment commanded by Col. ~~Crash~~
^{Col.} Alexander Scammell New Hampshire line that
he continued to serve in said service of the United States
in the revolutionary war on the Continental establishment
from April 1777 until the 19th day of April 1780
when he was discharged from service as Westport in

in the state of New York he then received a written discharge
which he left in the hands of his family and has not been able to find it
since and has no reason to believe that it is in existence

That he was in the battle of Fort Ann both at
Stillwater and at Monmouth - and that he is in
reduced circumstances and stands in need of the assis-
tance of his country for support -

I William Sawyer judge &c as aforesaid do certify that
it appears to my satisfaction that the said Beheviack Quincy
did serve in the revolutionary war as stated in the preceding
declaration against the common enemy for the term of nine
months on the Continental establishment and that he is in
reduced circumstances as stated in the preceding declaration
and I now transmit the proceedings and testimony taken
and had before me to the Secretary for the Department
of War pursuant to the directions of the aforementioned act of
Congress
