State of New Jersey.

Morris County Off. before me Daniel Norton one of the Judges  
of the Court of Common Pleas in said County personally  
appeared John Dinsby of said County a person to me well  
known worthy & sober who being duly sworn accord-  
ing to Law, doth on his oath make the following de-  
clarations in order to obtain the Provision made  
by the late Act of Congres. entitled "An Act to provide  
for certain persons engaged in the land and naval  
service of the United States in the Revolutionary War."  
that he enlisted at Rahway in the State of New  
Jersey <sup>in the year 1775</sup> with Capt Piatt of the first Jersey Regiment  
and marched with that Regiment, this enlistment  
was for one year, at the end of which term he was  
discharged in Albany, after his return home he a-  
gain enlisted in the early part of the year 1777  
with Capt Piatt of the first Jersey Regiment, for during  
the War, that he was wounded and taken Prisoner  
at the battle of Germantown in the State of Pennsylvania:  
and that he continued a prisoner at large being  
unable to perform actual service until the close  
of the War, when he was discharged at Philadelphia  
which he was allowed a Pension of \$2.50 per Month  
by the State of New Jersey and now stands on the  
Pension list of the United States, his claim to such  
Pension in future he doth hereby relinquish: that  
both his discharges have been destroyed or lost  
and are not now in his possession, nor at his com-  
mand. That he is in such reduced circumstances  
that he needs the assistance of his country for his  
support.

Madam:

In response to your letter of July 25<sup>th</sup>, you are advised that from the papers in the pension claim, S 33528, it appears that <sup>Quinby or</sup> John Quinby enlisted at Rahway, N. J. in 1775, served as a private under Capt. Platt, in the First New Jersey Regiment was wounded at the battle of Brandywine, nature of wound not stated, and was also taken prisoner, and remained a prisoner at large until the close of the War.

He was pensioned from May 1, 1786, on account of his wound, while living at Roxbury Township, Morris County, N. J. and he was living in said county in 1818.

There is no data on file as to his family, and no further data as to his service.
